We are providing our venue to host a Scotia Series Dressage Competition to help riders and horses develop their abilities to improve in the equestrian sport.

## **VENUE**

- Competition Ring is a 20M x 60m dressage outdoor dressage ring.
- Tests from the Training Level, First Level, Second Level, Third Level, Fourth Level and FEI Test of Choice will be ridden in the ring. Indoor arena warm-up for these tests
- Introductory Test will warm up inside and ride their tests in the regular sized indoor arena
- The viewing room of the main building has Wi-Fi and will be used for the competition office and canteen
- Washroom located inside indoor viewing room

#### **COMPETITION GUIDELINES**

- To participate in our competitions, we recommend your horse is vaccinated with Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4). This is not a requirement.
- Any horse who has requesting stabling at Swell Equestrian will be required to provide a vaccine certificate
  confirming your horse is up to date on vaccines for, Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) and
  Strangles vaccinations. Your Vaccine certificate are to be emailed to swellequestrian@gmail.com
- Classes will be split into Junior and Senior
  - Senior Competitors are defined as 19 years old and older as of January 1st, 2025
  - Junior Competitors are defined as 18 years old and under as of January 1st, 2025
- Anyone wishing to lunge must request permission from the event organizer and use designated area.
- All participants, regardless of discipline, must wear ASTM/SEI, or BSI/BS EN approved protective headgear, with the safety harness correctly secured at all times while mounted anywhere on the show grounds.
- Attire:
  - Required Safe, neat/tidy attire of conservative colour, and long sleeved or short sleeved shirt with a collar. Sleeveless shirts are not allowed. Protective headgear as described above. Juniors are permitted to wear jodhpurs and boots. Athletes with long hair must wear hair nets or tie hair back in a braid or bun.
  - Recommended Dark, grey, or conservative pinstriped coloured jacket, tie, hunting sock or choker, conservative-coloured breeches, black or brown high boots, short boots with matching half chaps.
  - <u>Exception</u> In the case of inclement weather, competitors may wear a suitable helmet cover and a warm or waterproof overcoat.

#### Tack:

- In keeping with the tradition and dignity of the sport, manes may be braided and the competitor's dress and tack neat, clean and in good repair.
- o Spurs are optional.
- o Whips are allowed. Maximum length is 100cm for pony and 120cm for a horse.
- o Saddles: A plain English saddle, black or brown colour only with stirrups is compulsory in all levels.
- o Bridles: All bridles must be correctly fitted.
- o Reins must be black or brown in colour. Type of reins is optional.
- Snaffle bridle with one of the following nosebands: drop, regular cavesson, flash, figure 8, or crescent are allowed. All bits must be smooth with no sharp edges on center links. Snaffles and curb bits with smooth ridges are permitted.
- Up to and including Second Level: Only snaffle bits are allowed.
- Breastplates, foregirths, girth covers, cruppers, and non-restrictive nose fly guards and ear nets are permitted.
- Martingales, bit guards, any kind of gadgets, and any form of blinkers, ear plugs, seat covers, and hoods are strictly forbidden on the competition grounds and competition ring/warm-up ring at any time during any competition (under penalty of elimination).
- Protective boots or bandages are not permitted in the competition ring; however, they are permitted on competition grounds or at the discretion of the judges. Athletes may be asked to remove the boots or bandages during a tack check.
- Participants are asked to be ready for their scheduled time.
- Test readers will not be provided by the organizer.
- Tests may be called. Callers must use the exact wording as it appears on the test. When calling any
  movement, it may only be repeated once by the caller. The provision of a caller is the responsibility of the
  competitor. Callers must stand at either E or B and remain 2-meters outside of the ring. The accuracy of the
  test remains the responsibility of the competitor regardless of errors made by their caller.
- Participants riding a Test Of Choice (TOC) must indicate which test on their application form and bring a blank copy for the clinician or competition judge. Free style tests are not an option. TOC is not a Scotia Series class.
- Equestrian Nova Scotia or PTSO membership is required to participate competition.
- All tests will be the most current versions available (2023 EC USEF)
- Scotia Series competitions are approved to offer up to Fourth Level
- Western Dressage Tests will be from the Western Dressage Association of Canada
- If competing in Para-Dressage, athletes do not need to be classified however, it is the responsibility of each competitor and coach to ensure all compensating aids used in competition are listed on the FEI Para-

Dressage acceptable compensating aid list or have been documented correctly on their EC Classification Profile or Para-Dressage Dispensation Certificate. The compensating aid list outlines standard aids (https://inside.fei.org/system/files/Compensating%20Aids%20Photo%20List%20Para%20Dressage 0.pdf).

- Horses may compete at any level up to a maximum of four tests for the day and no more than two consecutive levels. More than one rider may ride the same horse but not in the same class.
- Ribbons awarded to 5th place per level. Any horse receiving less than 50% is not eligible for ribbons, awards or prizes. Ribbons will be presented at Presentation Square.
- Highpoint Junior and High Point Senior Sores will be presented to each level at the end of the day at Presentation Square
- If only one horse in a class, than ribbons awarded on a percentage as follows: 1st—60% or higher, 2nd—57-59,9%, 3rd—54-56%, 4th—51-53.9%. Only four placings in this situation.
- Please note on your entry form that we now request the name of your Coach if you are using their services at the competition. If you do not, please indicate that you are self coached. COACHES /PERSON RESPONSIBLE PLEASE NOTE information regarding Safe Sport included in this prize list.
- In case of a rider, or horse fall, riders are to leave the ring unmounted.
- Any rider that may in the opinion of the judge and/or management be considered riding at risk of injury to themselves or their horse will be asked to withdraw for the balance of the competition
- The welfare of the horse is paramount in our sport therefore the judge and/or management reserves the right to ask a horse to retire, in the event that it appears that it would not be productive for the horse to continue. This may be due to heat, unsoundness, or distress of the horse.
- Bridle numbers must be worn whenever the horse is not in a stall or trailer, including all handwalking.



Safe Sport standards are in place for officials, coaches, and persons responsible for junior-aged athletes at our Scotia Series competition. These are in place to meet federal and provincial government requirements and most importantly, so that everyone has the right to feel safe and to participate in an accessible and inclusive sport environment. Please ensure that you meet the Equestrian NS Board-Approved standards prior to coming to our competition. Details and support can be found at:

## **STABLING**

- Limited stabling is available to competitors.
- Cost is \$50.00 per day/night including HST.
- Bring your own bedding or you can purchase wood pellets bags from us for \$10.00 per bag including HST.
- Any horse who is requesting stabling at Swell Equestrian will be required to provide a vaccine certificate
  confirming your horse is up to date on vaccines for, Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) and
  Strangles vaccinations. Horses not in compliance with this in the stabling area may be asked to leave the
  event site at the discretion of Competition Management.
- Vaccine certificates must be emailed to swelleguestrian@gmail.com by the entry closing date.

# WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION

After the closing date Wednesday, April 23, a full refund can return to the entry minus the Administration Fee plus hst with a Veterinarian Certificate.

- Entries close and payments are due Wednesday April 23, 2025 for the Saturday May 3 Show.
- Entries close and payments are due Friday June 20, 2025 for the Saturday June 28 Show.
- Entries close and payments are due Friday August 29, 2025 for the Saturday September 6 Show
- Post entries will not be accepted on the day of the competition.

Our venue retains liability coverage and demands the same from each participant at the Swell Equestrian location. All registrants must have the signature of the owner or authorized agent and a signature for the person responsible for the horse. Riders will not be allowed to participate without a signature from the person responsible.

Junior participants (under the age of 19) must have permission to participate in the competition as indicated by the signature of a parent or guardian on waiver.
